

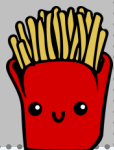
As scientists we will be exploring the different states of matter (solid, liquids and gas) and identify what the water cycle is and the processes involved (precipitation, condensation, evaporation, cooling, heating).



As artists we will be developing drawing skills through careful observation of still life objects which consider different shading techniques inspired by the work of Paul Cezanne.



As design and technologists we will be incorporating slicing and measuring to create a healthy alternative to fried chips and tomato ketchup.



In Spanish we will be learning how to use the correct vocabulary for basic greetings in short conversational exchanges.



As geographers we will be using maps of the World and Europe to locate Italy and its capital city of Rome.



As musicians we will be using a brass instrument to make a range of notes.



As historians we will find reasons for the Roman invasion of Britain, the resistance to this invasion and the legacy left behind by the Romans.



In Computing we will learn how to design and write a programme, including forever loops, to create an animated scene.

In PSHRE, we will learn why being democratic is important and how it helps us and others feel valued. We will also look at why bullying might be difficult to spot and what to do if we are not sure.

In PE we will be learning how to pass a large ball using an overarm technique, a chest pass and a shoulder pass. In gymnastics, we will create a controlled and balanced sequence of movements incorporating different rolls and jumps.

In maths we will be learning:

- Rounding number to nearest 10 and 100
- Addition and subtraction

We will then write a set of instructions linked to our history topic.
